Let me now briefly introduce our College.

Our College is a co-educational constituent College of University of Delhi. It was established by the Government of NCT of Delhi in the Trans-Yamuna area in 1991 to cater to the needs of higher education in a school building of Geeta Colony. In 2001, the College shifted to the present building, the foundation stone of which was laid by the then Hon'ble Vice-President of India (Hon'ble Sh. K. R. Narayanan Ji). It is spread over 9 acres including a residential area having 12 staff quarters.

With a total student strength of about 3100 (39% girl students), it has got about 116 faculty members and about 56 regular members of the administrative staff besides a few contractual and ad-hoc/deputational staff. The College offers a number of professional and Honours courses like Business Economics, Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication, Applied Psychology, Social Work, Commerce, Geography and History in addition to B.A.(Programme) and B.Com. Urdu as an elective subject and B.A. (H) Economics and Hindi were introduced during the last academic year. The College is privileged to have WUS Health Centre in its premises to look after the healthcare needs of College students and the staff of University of Delhi.

Our College also supplements efforts of the University in meeting the needs of higher education. It is one of the Regional-cum-Study Centres to facilitate undergraduate teaching for School of Open

Learning (SOL), and for girl students of Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB, University of Delhi). Our College also acts as one of the Centres of Rajiv Gandhi National Institute of Youth Development, Ministry of Youth Affairs & Sports, Tamil Nadu, that offers a one year Post Graduate Diploma in Youth Development (PGDYD). Thanks to Dr. Arvind Kumar Yadav, Dr. D.K. Pandeya and Dr. Ravindra Singh who have been coordinating those works.

The College also functions as one of the 20 Earthquake Strong Ground Motion Stations in Delhi for recording and monitoring earthquakes in Delhi under the project jointly handled by Director of Seismology Division (DST)-DU-IIT (Roorkee).

While constantly striving to improve its Good Practices, for which 'Special Commendation Prize' was awarded by University of Delhi, the college has registered well in time and much ahead of others with GeM for purchases and PFMS for Government Grants.

Before elaborating on the College activities, let me recall the year 2015-16. This Silver Jubilee Year was celebrated by organizing a number of activities to prepare its students for the future through training beyond class room besides cultural and sports events.

The College took many initiatives during the last year. As a part of the *Ek Bharat Shreshtha Bharat* initiative of the Government of India to strengthen the unity and integrity of India and to enhance understanding and bonding between the States and UTs through the exchange of cultural knowledge, traditions and practices, the National Capital Territory of Delhi has been earmarked as a partner state along with the seven North Eastern states. In this context, the College North East Cell organised a Cultural Programme (*Bihu* dance) and made a Power Point presentation on the society and culture of Assam (2nd March 2017). Besides this, the Assam Week (6th-11th March 2017) and Sikkim Week (20th -24th March 2017) were also observed. The College also organised an 'Exhibition of Handicraft of Sikkim' (2nd February 2018) and various cultural programmes.

During this period, various cultural programmes like *Bihu* dance and Assamese group songs were performed by the College students and faculties. More than 500 persons visited the exhibition stall set up for displaying various cultural items like handloom products, handicrafts, food items, books, photos etc. of Assam and Sikkim. The prominent guests who visited the stall were Dr. Anil Kumar Kalkal, Mr. Karan Puri, Prof. Ari Lindeman, Finland, Ms. Binita Rai, Government of Sikkim and Pranesh Chettri, President of Sikkim Students' Association, Delhi. The valedictory function on 24th March 2017 was held by Prof. Ari Lindeman, who gave an enlightening speech on the 'Role of entrepreneurship and innovation in youth development'. This programme was widely appreciated. Thanks to Ms. N. Victoria Chanu, Dr. Pratibha Verma, Dr. Rajbala Gautam and their teams.

You will be happy to know that our college students and employees featured in the *Mann Ki Baat* of the Hon'ble P.M. of India, which was directly broadcasted with College as one of the Centres by DD News Channel (30th April 2017). Our College probably was the only College in the entire Delhi that got featured in this popular program. Thanks to our Alumnus Mr. Girish Nishana.

The College before starting its regular academic life generally organizes an Open Day Session in order to guide the young students seeking admission in the University. This year on 6th June 2017, about 200 students and their parents participated enthusiastically in this session. A wide variety of admission related issues were addressed by University experts including Dr. Tuteja and Dr. (Ms.) Amrita Bajaj. Thanks to them and the College Team led by Dr. R.P. Dwivedi and Dr. Nalin Kumar with Sanket and Komal as student volunteers.

The Open Day Session was followed by an Orientation Programme, which was organized on 20th July 2017 to welcome the newly admitted young students. Dr. A.K. Singhla (IPS) gave an enlightening speech to the young students about the role of college education in their life and what they could achieve by doing hard work during their college life. Thanks to Dr. Sarla Bhardwaj, Dr. M.S. Vats and Dr. Diljeet Kaur.

As we all know, this College is on the name of Bharat Ratna Baba Saheb, Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar. He was a multi-faceted personality-a great legal luminary known as the Father of the Indian Constitution, a social scientist par excellence, a prolific writer and an editor, a great social reformer and a brilliant orator. In order to acknowledge and create awareness about his vast academic work among students and his contribution towards improving lot of socially disadvantaged sections of population and building a new India based on the principles of justice, liberty, equality and fraternity, the College started Baba Saheb Bhim Rao Ambedkar Memorial Lecture Series in 2007 (the year, I joined) on the occasion of his birth anniversary. Since then, it has been continuing.

The inaugural Baba Saheb Memorial lecture was delivered by Prof. Namvar Singh on 14th April 2007 and the last Lecture (13th April 2017) was delivered by Prof. Bidyut Chakravarty (Keynote Speaker) followed by Prof P.K. Chaubey (Expert Speaker) and concluding remarks by Dr. Shriram Oberoi. Thanks to these well-known Professors and the Coordinators Dr. Diljeet Kaur and Dr. Arvind Yadav and their teams.

You will be happy to know that the theme of the second and forthcoming issue of College Research Journal 'Academia' is Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar: An Architect of Modern India'. Thanks to Prof. Surender Kumar (Delhi School of Economics) and Prof. Sushma Yadav (UGC Member and former Prof. of Dr. B. R. Ambedkar Chair at IIPA) for giving their consent to be the Guest Editors for this issue. Dr. Bishnu Mohan Dash and his team deserve thanks for making continuous efforts.

Our College paid a homage to Bharat Ratna Baba Saheb Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar on the occasion of his 61st *Maha Parinirvaan Divas* (6th December 2017). The contribution of Baba Saheb was recalled with a floral tribute to him, while involving the young sports students participating in Cricket Training at the College. Thanks to our students and the College staff led by Dr. M. S. Vats, Dr. P. K. Singh, Dr. Dhananjay Kumar and Mr. Purshottam.

The College works towards social responsibility by directly participating and creating awareness among the youth. In the past, it made tangible efforts towards playing a key role in the University of Delhi and Integral Learning Project (UDAI II) undertaken in flood hit areas of Bihar, and assisted GNCTD in organizing its programme of recalling the contribution of Baba Saheb on the occasion of 26th November 2016 at Constitution Club, New Delhi. In line with this, the College celebrated the Constitution Day (26th November 2017), wherein a large number of teachers and students particularly from the Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board (NCWEB) took a pledge to fulfill their fundamental duties. Thanks to Dr. D.K. Pandeya and his NCWEB Team.

As a part of Government of India's Awareness Programme about the Vigilance Awareness Week, our College organised a programme, 'My Vision- Corruption Free India' in association with Oriental Bank of Commerce (3rd November 2017). Mr. S.K. Goel, P. Sreedhar, Parveen Guglami and Dr. Kishore Rajnish shared their long experiences and motivated the young students. The College also organised a Drive cum Special Camp to enroll left-out voters (27th and 28th July 2017) while focusing on first time Voters especially the young Indian citizens in the age group of 18-21 years. These programmes were in line with the efforts being made by the Election Commission of India through

its various programmes to strengthen the democratic roots of India. Thanks to Dr. Ravinder Singh who coordinated this programme.

The College operationalized an Open Gym with 17 work-out machines and created a Yoga and Meditation Hut made of eco-friendly bamboo stuff and an Acupressure Path with pointed stones of different sizes. It was widely reported in Media and aired on DD News. The girls' medical room is currently being made operationalized to take care of medical/counseling needs of girl students.

The College recognizes that teaching-learning can be improved by creating a research environment and enhancing writing skills. In order to promote the research activities, the College has published an International Multidisciplinary Journal 'Academia' and two Monographs which were released on 16th January 2018 in the presence of a number of teaching staff. Thanks to Prof. Rakesh K. Seth, Chairperson, Prof. Ashok K. Prasad, former Chairperson, Prof. H. S. Prasad, Department of Philosophy and Prof. J. P. Dubey, Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences and Dr. Shriram Oberoi for gracing this occasssion. Thanks to our programme Coordinators Dr. B.M. Dash and Mr. Purshottam and their Teams. Teachers encourage young students to cultivate Research inclination. As a result, students of Department of BBE/BMS (Abhishek Talwar, Srimann Gupta, Vijay Swami, Roshan Kumar, Aman Jain and Yash Singhal) have contributed more than 20 research papers and articles in the various UGC listed National and International Journals of Research in the area of Finance and Management and also won Best Paper Award (Dishant Sharma and Vikrant Thakur).

The college has already processed and finalized three important academic ventures: (i) An International Conference on 'Business Strategies for Promoting Inclusive Development' on 17th - 18th March 2018 in association with South Asian Management Association; (ii) A National Seminar on 'Autonomy of Education: Challenges and Solutions' on 23rd-24th February 2018 in association with Jawaharlal Nehru University and *Shiksha Sanskriti Utthan Nyas*; and (iii) a National Seminar on 'Indian Social Work: Scope & Challenges' on 14th-15th March 2018 in association with *Mahatma Gandhi Antarrashtriya Hindi Vishvavidyalaya*. We take this opportunity to thank all these institutions and their officers including Prof. Girishwar Misra, Prof. Anil Mehra, Prof. Zutsi and Dr. A. Kothari. Thanks to Dr. B.M. Dash, Dr. D.K. Pandeya, Dr. Vinod Kumar and Dr. Anil Kumar for their constant efforts.

The College contributes towards women empowerment, gender justice and development by organizing a number of different activities under the aegis of its Gender Sensitization and Women Development Committee. The Committee organised a 10-day programme on self-defence and selected 20 Gender Champions based on the initiatives of University of Delhi (28th March 2017). Besides, it also organised a debate competition, a talent show, apparel styling and a counseling session to discuss matrimonial issues that arise when students still pursue their graduation or are amidst their College studies. Thanks to Dr. Monica Ahlawat.

Within our constraints, we also work towards the nation building through our NSS and NCC units and encourage a variety of student friendly schemes.

The College NSS unit with 125 volunteers took many initiatives. It observed: (1) an International Peace Day (21st September 2017) that was graced by Ms. Bhasha Singh, Shri Srijan Nanda and Prof. Manoj K. Jha who shared their deep insights into the subject of peace, and its importance in today's world; (2) a Blood Donation Camp (8th January 2018) in collaboration with All India Institute of Medical Sciences (AIIMS), in which more than 100 students participated and donated blood for the noble cause; and (3) Awareness programme for Road Safety in collaboration with Delhi Police.

Some interesting and knowledgeable activities included a Nukkad Natak on 'Don't Drink and Drive', an essay writing competition, a workshop and screening of documentaries. The College NSS team led by its student Coordinators Rajat Kumar, Soni and Ajay and further monitored by the NSS programme office Dr. Ravindra Singh and his team deserve appreciation.

The College NCC unit (now having about 343 cadets) was started in 1993 under the guidance of Major (Dr.) M. S. Vats. It has two Army Wings (one each for boys and girls), a Naval Wing and an Air Wing (registered at 1 Delhi Air Sqn, C Group). With 128 cadets of Army Boys Wing and 160 Cadets of Army Girls Wing, the College NCC is well acknowledged not only in the University, but also in the Army units. Like every year, our cadets got selected in various camps like Republic Day Camp, National Integration Camp, *Thal Sainik Camp*, PM Rally, Mountaineering, *Amar Jawan Jyoti*, Youth Exchange Programme, Trekking, IMA etc.

Let me recall the 26th January 2018. Keeping up the old traditions, our 5 cadets of Army and Naval Wings represented the College in the Republic Day Camp. JUO Shubham Srivastava, SGT Hari Shankar, CDT Mohit, CC Sanjay, CC Sumit deserve appreciation and congrats. JUO Shubham also did a contingent commentary for the Republic Day Parade 2018. SGT Hari Shankar won the 2nd prize in Delhi Best Cadet Competition organised by the College Alumni.

The College NCC unit also organised an Annual Fest 'Lakshya' (3rd March 2017) to highlight their achievements. The various events that were held in this fest included Quarter Guard Competition (SD/SW), Squad Drill Competition (JD/SW), Best Cadet Competition (SD/SW) along with Group Dance and Solo Dance. The College thanks Major General Sunil Kumar, ADG Brigadier Udai Yadav, Group Commander NCC 'B' Group, Colonel Rajnish Pratap, Colonel Amit Seghal, Colonel Gaurav Karki and Captain KSN Naidu. Thanks to Dr. Rajbir Vats, Dr. Arvind Kumar Yadav, Dr. Kanika and their cadets.

The College is proud of its NCC cadets including SGT Hari Shankar Yadav, JUO Shubham, SGT Asif Choudhary, CPL Manish Kumar, SGT Vikash Sukhla, CPL Akshey Gautam, JUO Mobassir Alam along with others who got selected to participate in different activities organised by Army units. In addition, these cadets participated in a variety of social service activities including *Swachh Bharat Abhiyan*, Tree Plantation and Environment Awareness, Run for Unity, Assistance to Traffic Control, Anti-Tobacco Campaign and so on.

Our NCC (Army, Girls Wing) with an enrolment of 160 cadets, with SUO Garima Agarwal, JUO Tayyaba and JUO Shivani Tanwar, Cadets JUO Supriya and JUO Pooja Tiwari has become very popular over the period with an enrolment of about 160 cadets. Some of our cadets won different competitions and got selected in different activities organised by Army Units.

Two of our girl cadets, CPL Kajal and Kritika participated in the PM Rally in the presence of Hon'ble Prime Minister of India, Army Chief Sh. Bipin Rawat, Admiral Sh. Sunil Lanba and Air Chief Marshall Birender Singh Dhanoa.

Our NCC Naval Wing has 50 cadets. Out of these, 2 cadets passed with 'C' certificate and 7 cadets passed with 'B' certificate. SUO Rohit and his team of 16 cadets participated in Combined Annual Training Camp 2018. They won 1st prize in Solo Dance Competition. CDT Virendra Pratap Verma won 1st prize in Solo Dance and Cadet Sushma Rani won 1st prize in Tug of War Competition. Baby Rai won 2nd prize in Basketball. Sushma Rani and Gulshan got selected in Amar Jawan Jyoti Camp. A number of our cadets participated in NCC National Camp and Run for Unity programme etc. on the occasion of the birth anniversary of Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel and other major events such as

Swachh Bharat Abhiyan.

Sir, you will be happy to know that our NCC Unit not only helps in nation building, but also makes a positive contribution in encouraging and facilitating the College administration particularly during admission period when they are involved in the maintenance of discipline which is the most difficult task as thousands of people visit the College during those few days.

I am happy to share with you that ever since our College was nominated by GNCTD and the NCC Unit 2 Delhi Girls Battalion as the Nodal Agency for organizing a Mega Event to Popularize Yoga on the occasion of International Yoga Day (21st June 2015), we have been continuing with Yoga Training of students from 07:45-08:45 A.M. daily in the College under the supervision of trained Yoga instructors from *Bhartiya Yoga Sansthan*. NCC and other students enrolled with us are getting trained which is being facilitated by the College Yoga Committee led by Dr. Sangeeta Sharma and Ex-Sr. Cadet Vijender Singh Baghel under the overall guidance of Major (Dr.) M.S. Vats. Thanks to them.

Following an initiative of MHRD, the College participated in 'The Wall of Heroes' programme (2nd June 2017). While using the knowledge and guidance from MHRD officials, the College created this wall to depict the portraits of War Warriors honoured with *Param Veer Chakra*-India's highest military decoration for showing extraordinary courage and bravery to defend our country. The programme was inaugurated by Shri Hari Om Panwar, a renowned *Veer Rasa* poet.

Given that our College is located in a relatively low economic profile area of Delhi, the requirements of our heterogeneous group of students are different from those of other colleges. The college works to empower students in many ways. Students are encouraged to avail government sponsored Development Schemes and scholarships particularly meant for students belonging to the weaker sections including SC/ST/OBC/PwD/Minorities and others. The College and its Welfare/Fee Committee recommended 115 students for financial assistance.

In order to encourage holistic development of student creativity and motivate other students, a programme 'Youth for Well-Being' was organized (23rd October 2017). The distinguished guests (Mr. Suneel Vatsyayan and Dr. Preeti Soni), talked about mental health, mood and behaviour of the youth. The North East Cell organized an orientation programme and workshop on 'Youth, Emloyment and Development' in North East India on 30th October 2017 that was highly appreciated and enjoyed by our students. Thanks to Dr. Otojit Kshterimayum, from V.V. Giri National Labour Institute, Noida; and Ms. N. Victoria Chanu and her Team.

The College recognizes that nature care and environmental educations are crucial for sustainable human development, which in fact has to be made inclusive. The Eco-Club, constituted in 2009, has brought about a noticeable change. This year as many as 55 students joined the Team of Green Cadets. These Cadets combine the discipline of NCC, commitment of community development and love for nature. This club organized a number of activities to create awareness towards Mother Nature. The College gratefully acknowledges the tree plantation drive (21st April 2017) sponsored by Larsen and Toubro.

Our Herbal Park with more than 110 medicinal plant varieties and Rose Garden with more than 84 plant varieties maintained under the guidance of Eco-Club continue to win top positions in Delhi University Flower Shows every year ever since we started participating in 2010. The college won Department of Sociology Cup in 59th Delhi University Annual Flower Show 2017 (23rd February). The college prize score jumped from 2 in 2010 (the year of first time entry) to 12 in 2016. The

college has an inventory of 524 trees (48 varieties), with 159 belonging to Saptapri/*Alstonia scholaris* that is widely known for its anti-pollution qualities. Sharma), the 'Paper Recycling Unit' (Cordinator, Dr. S.S. Chawla), Gardening Committee (Convenor, Dr. Lalit Kumar). They and their teams including Mr. Joginder Singh and Sh. Ram Kumar deserve appreciation for putting in their hard labour in landscaping and beautification of the College.

In order to encourage appreciation and create awareness about International Cultures among our students, Department of Hindi organised an Indo-Japan Meet on 17th February 2017 in which 16 students from Japan participated. The Japanese students presented a Hindi group song followed by their views and experiences about India. Our college students also presented a beautiful Japanese group song and a group dance.
