The University of Delhi has restructured its B.A. Programme course with a view to providing a general understanding and foundation in Humanities. Contents of the programme make it an integrated and interdisciplinary course with flexible choices.

B.A. Programme has 24 papers described as under spread over a period of six semesters with 4 papers for each semester. There are four segments of this course: **Discipline, Language, AEC and SEC.** The distribution of various papers offered by the college is as under:
