## About the College

Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College (BRAC) came into existence on 8th Feb 1991 during the birth centenary year of Bharat Ratna Baba Saheb Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar. It is a constituent co- educational college of the University of Delhi and is 100 % funded by the Delhi Government. Since its inception, it has maintained its incessant momentum on the path of progress, both in academics and extra-curricular fields. The principal, teaching & non-teaching Staff have dedicated themselves to build an environment of holistic and inclusive learning, inspiring the youth to create a fruitful and responsible future. The college completed its Silver Jubilee (25th year of operation) in 2016 and the year was celebrated with several academic events, workshops, and conferences.

The college has a unique combination of academic and professional courses under the three-year bachelor's degree Programmes. The prominent academic programmes include B. Com & B. Com (Hons.), B.A. (Hons.) Geography, B.A. (Hons.) History and the evergreen B.A. (Programme). The college holds the unique distinction of being the forerunner in launching four professional courses of the University namely B.A. (Hons.) Hindi Journalism and Mass Communication which was introduced in 1994-95, B.A. (Hons.) Social Work and B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics which were started in 1995-96 and B.A. (Hons.) Applied Psychology which was introduced in 2007-08. The college has a distinction of offering some Commerce based courses like Human Resource Management (HRM) and Office Management and Secretarial Practice (OMSP) besides the Vocational Course like Functional Hindi (FH) to the students of BA (Programme).

The college is privileged to have WUS Health Centre in its premises to look after the health care needs of students of Delhi University and its employees. The College is situated near Gokulpuri Metro station. Under the capacity expansion plan initiated by the GNCTD, the University has selected our college as one of the Regional-cum-Study Centres to facilitate undergraduate teaching under Personal Contact Programme (PCP) for School of Open Learning (SOL) students. The college is also one of the Centres for teaching to the girl students under Non-Collegiate Women Education Board (NCWEB), University of Delhi. The study centre of Indira Gandhi National Open University (IGNOU) has been opened in July 2025 for learners enrolled in various courses.

## Academic system at BRAC

At BRAC, we prioritize classroom teaching and pedagogical innovation to provide an academically sound education. Our dedicated faculty members are committed to staying abreast of the latest developments in their respective fields, ensuring that our curriculum remains relevant and up to date. We foster an environment that encourages research, development, and innovation, extending learning beyond the confines of the classroom. In this regard, the college has organized many international conferences including ‘World Environment Summit

2020, 2021, 2022 & 2023’ and ‘Global Water Congress 2020 & 2022’ at BRAC, North Campus of Delhi University, JNU New Delhi, India International Centre, New Delhi, and Galgotias University, Greater Noida in partnership with the Environment and Social Development Association Delhi and other distinguished institutions to enhance the knowledge of the students about the global burning issues of our environment.

## Infrastructural Facilities

### College Library



The College Library is housed in a separate building and has about 40,901 (as on 20/01/2020) books and is fully computerized with online facilities. The college presently subscribes to around 54 periodicals . The list can be appended on the recommendation of Teachers. Books are provided to economically weaker students through the Students Aid Fund (SAF). The library has created a space for 100 readers and separate air-conditioned space for teachers. The library has Wi-Fi enabled air-



conditioned cabins, digital pocket player, and text to speech converter and braille books for the benefit of EOC Students. Online facilities like OPAC, N-List (e-journals) through INFLIBNET are also available in the library. There is a separate section on Ambedkar, Gandhi, Nehru and other such personalities. A cabin is also provided for the exclusive use of differently abled persons. ‘Sugamya Pustakalay’ facility has been started for ‘Divyangjan’. The library is online, and a link is provided on the college website. Since 2005 the library is computerized and Libsys software is used for acquisition, cataloguing and circulation of books. Plagiarism checking facility is also available.

### Computer Labs:



The college is well-equipped with IT facilities with four computer labs, internet access and multimedia projectors. The college has high-speed internet connectivity with 120 Mbps fiber optics as well as broadband connections. Computer Labs are equipped with two 10KVA and three 5 KVA and 1KVA online UPSs for power backup. The college has installed hardware Firewall for internet security and authentication purpose. The College campus is in process of enabling Wi-Fi. for campus. (Under progress) Wi-fi is available in Admin Block and Media block. The college has established an IT Hub including 92



computers and 2 servers with the latest configuration. The college received 833 laptops from the University. These were distributed to first year students and faculty members.

To improve IT infrastructure and teaching methodology, the college has installed 24 multimedia projectors provided by Delhi University in the classrooms with 20 numbers of laptops to teach students through it. Computers Labs are with Projectors and interactive boards.

The college has installed Latest IP based 96 CCTVs Camera at different points in keeping view of Students and College Security, the security arrangements are updated, and ragging is checked periodically. The college has a website, [www.drbrambedkarcollege.ac.in](http://www.drbrambedkarcollege.ac.in), which is regularly updated. Students should regularly see the college website to update themselves about the important notices and activities of the college. All faculty members have been given e-mail IDs on the college domain provided by the University.

### **Auditorium**

The college has a fully air-conditioned auditorium with a capacity of about 250 persons. The auditorium is equipped with audio-visual facilities such as floor mikes, hand mikes, a computer, a screen, and a projector. It is used for holding seminars, workshops, lectures and debates for the benefit of students and the faculty. **A Green Room** near Auditorium has been constructed.



### **Photocopy Facility**

A Stationery-cum-Photostat Shop is available in the college and provides Xeroxing, printing, and stationary facility to students at reasonable rates.

**Department of Business Economics** offers the B.A. (Hons.) Business Economics programme, designed to equip students with strong academic, professional, and research capabilities alongside a vibrant co-curricular experience. The faculty brings extensive experience and domain expertise, contributing significantly to the department's academic environment. The noteworthy contribution comes from the students of the department who have presented over 60 research papers at national and international conferences including the conferences organized by IIMs, IITs, IIFT and other top institutions of the country. The students also have a rich tradition of frequently winning best paper awards. The Department boasts two dynamic student-led platforms: Innovate, the Departmental Society, and MaivenAide, the consulting cell. These bodies actively organize key events such as the BBE Corporate Meet, which brings alumni back to campus, and Radiance, the Department's annual festival. Additionally, various seminars and workshops are conducted regularly, including TEDx Talks, Career Counselling sessions, Student Research Paper Writing and Data Analysis Workshops featuring experts from academia and industry. A dedicated Placement Team supports students in securing internships and job opportunities. Graduates of the programme are successfully placed as management trainees, data analysts, research analysts, financial market analysts, and entry-level professionals across corporate sectors. Many alumni also pursue higher studies at premier institutions in India and abroad, including IIM Ahmedabad, IIM Lucknow, IIM Rohtak, IIM Kashipur, XLRI, FORE School of Management, XIMB, Madras School of Economics, and Delhi University.

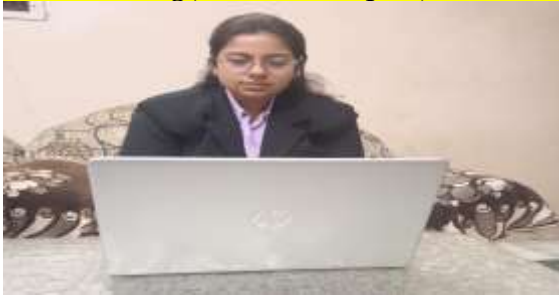

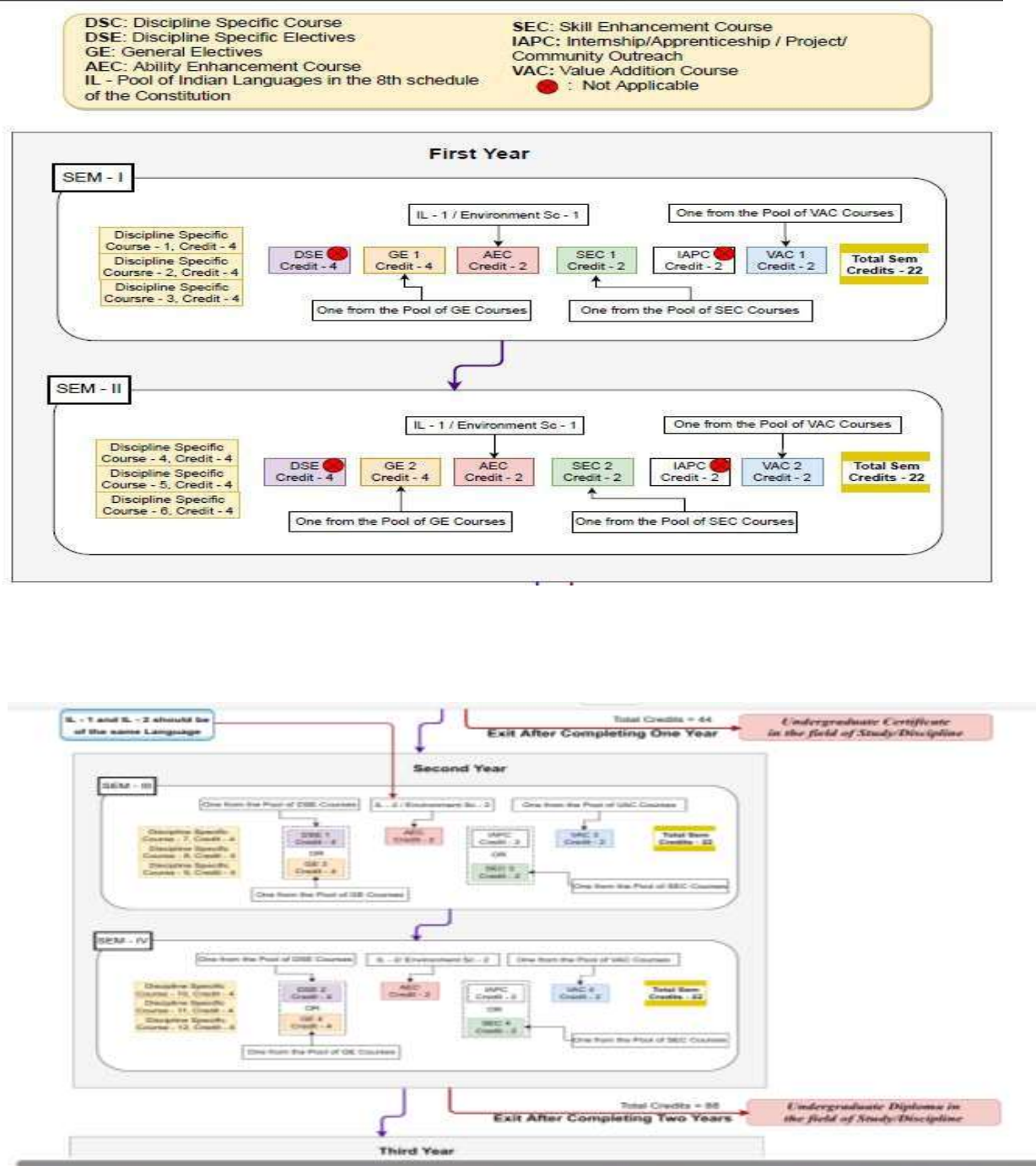

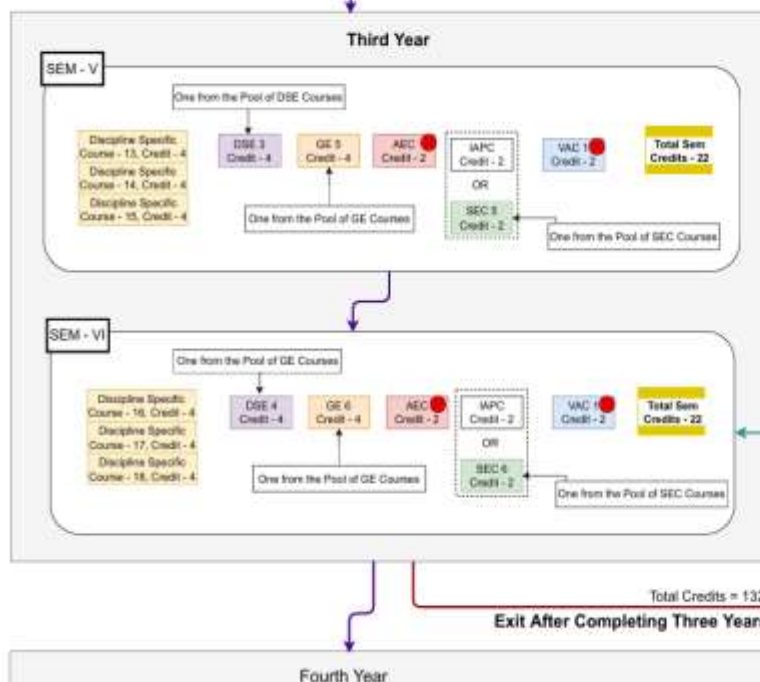


## Course Structure: BA(H) Business Economics

BA(H)Business Economics is a four year degree programme with multiple exit options. The course outline for all four years is displayed as a flowchart and spread over two pages as under:-

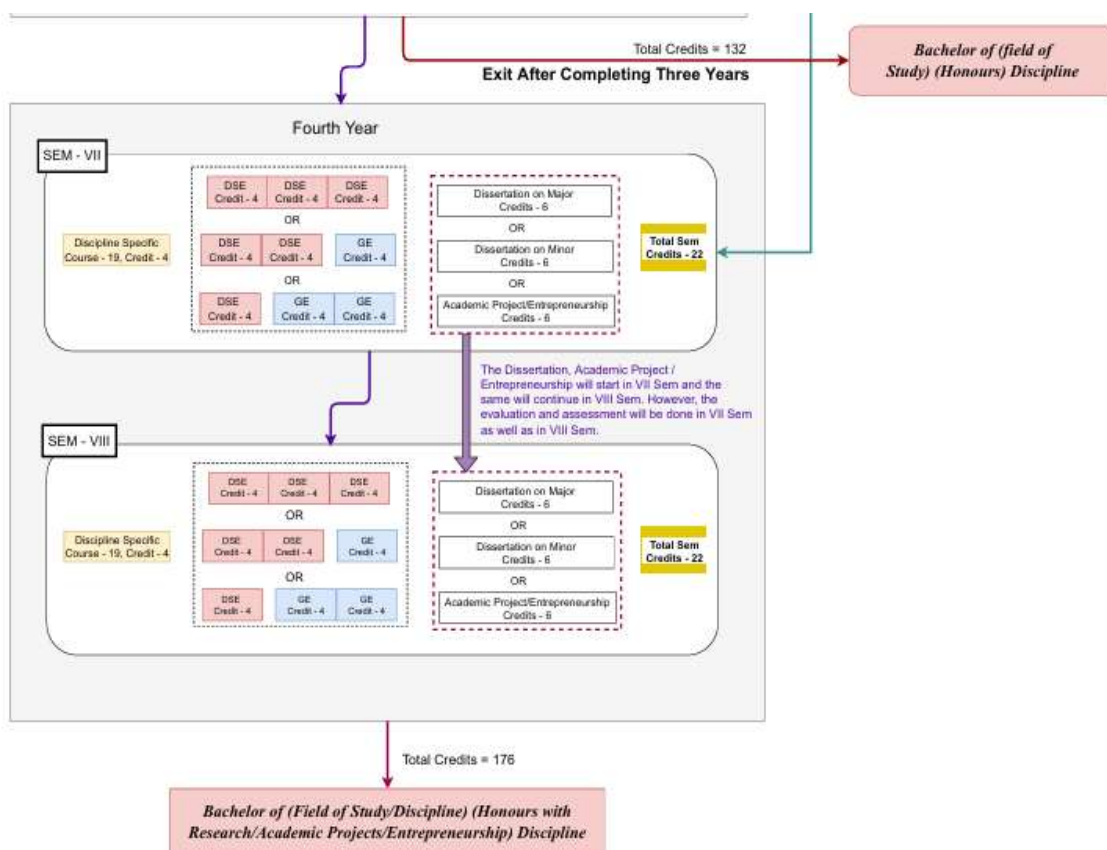

## BA(H) Business Economics (Sem I and II)

A student of 1<sup>st</sup> year has to study three Discipline Specific Courses (DSC) which is mandatory to all the students of the Department. A student is also required to study Generic Elective (GE), Ability Enhancement Course (ACC), Skill Enhancement Course (SEC) and Value Added Course (VAC) in 1<sup>st</sup> year, such courses are however choice based courses and details for the same shall be provided by the college.

The list of Discipline Specific Core Papers to be offered by Department in 1<sup>st</sup> year is enclosed. A student is required to study three DSC courses in each semester.

### General Guidelines

- A student pursuing an Under-graduate degree has an option to do 'Major' and 'Minor' in UG four-year Programme.
- The student shall do 'Major' in the core discipline, i.e., Business Economics
- Minor, however mandatorily requires the student to successfully complete 7 Generic Electives (GEs) under UG Programme.

**For Ex:** If a student pursuing BA(H) Business Economics chooses seven GE courses of Economics and writes dissertation, He/ She shall be awarded on successful completion of VIII Semesters, Major in Business Economics and Minor in Economics.

- Caution should be taken to choose all the seven GEs from one single department to qualify for a 'Minor'. This means that the student will be required to earn at least 28 GE credit points from one specific department only.
- The student while choosing GE to do 'Minor' will Not be allowed to take GE offered by his/her parent\* department. The parent department is the one the student has sought admission in and wishes to major in).

### Guidelines: DSCs (Discipline Specific Core)

The student will be studying three DSCs each semester in the first year.

### **Guidelines: GE (Generic Elective)**

The student may choose any **One** GE paper from the GE Pool List meant for Hons Courses in each semester offered by the college in 2024-25

The students are required to note that GE paper must not be the ones being offered by their parent Department. The parent department is the one the student has sought admission into, and wishes to major in.

### **Guidelines: AEC (Ability Enhancement Course)**

1. As Per NEP, two Papers are to be studied under AEC i.e., AEC-EVS (Environmental Studies) and AEC- MIL. (Modern Indian Language)
2. Both are mandatory papers for all students. Students will be required to study one AEC paper in each Semester.
3. To manage the overall number of students in each AEC in a semester, the bifurcation of students has been done and is as follows:

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# Department of Economics

Economics has been and continues to be an extremely popular choice of course for students pursuing the bachelor degree. Economics is the study of how economic activities are organized by societies, governments, businesses, households, and individuals by allocating their scarce resources to meet unlimited needs in the perspective of sustainable human development. Economists are well known for advising the government on economic issues, formulating policies for the central bank and at fiscal and the welfare front. It also offers a tool with which to approach questions about the desirability of a particular financial investment opportunity, the benefits and costs of alternative choices and the likely impacts of public policies. The complementary study of econometrics, the primary quantitative method used in the discipline, enables students to become critical consumers of statistically based arguments about numerous public and private issues rather than passive recipients unable to shift through the statistics. Such knowledge enables them to ask whether the evidence on the desirability of a particular policy, claims about the likely future path of the economy, or other issues are compelling or whether it simply sounds good but falls apart upon closer inspection.

In this discipline students learn conceptual and empirical models of behavior to predict responses to changes in policy and market conditions and how statistical and mathematical analysis are used to investigate these changes.

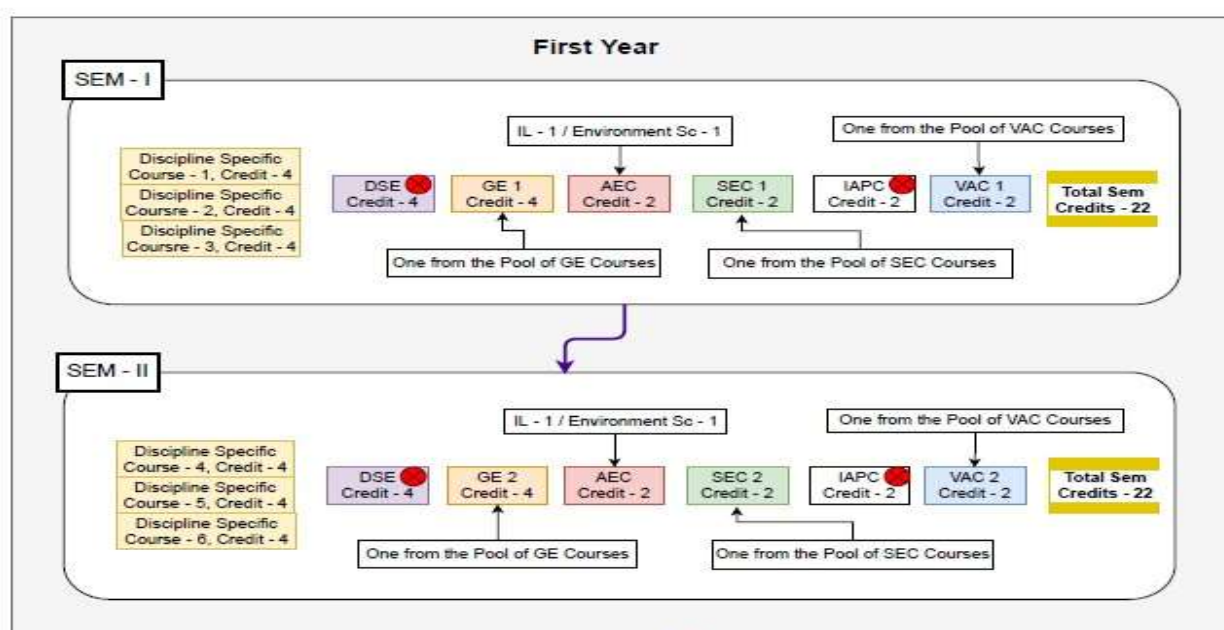

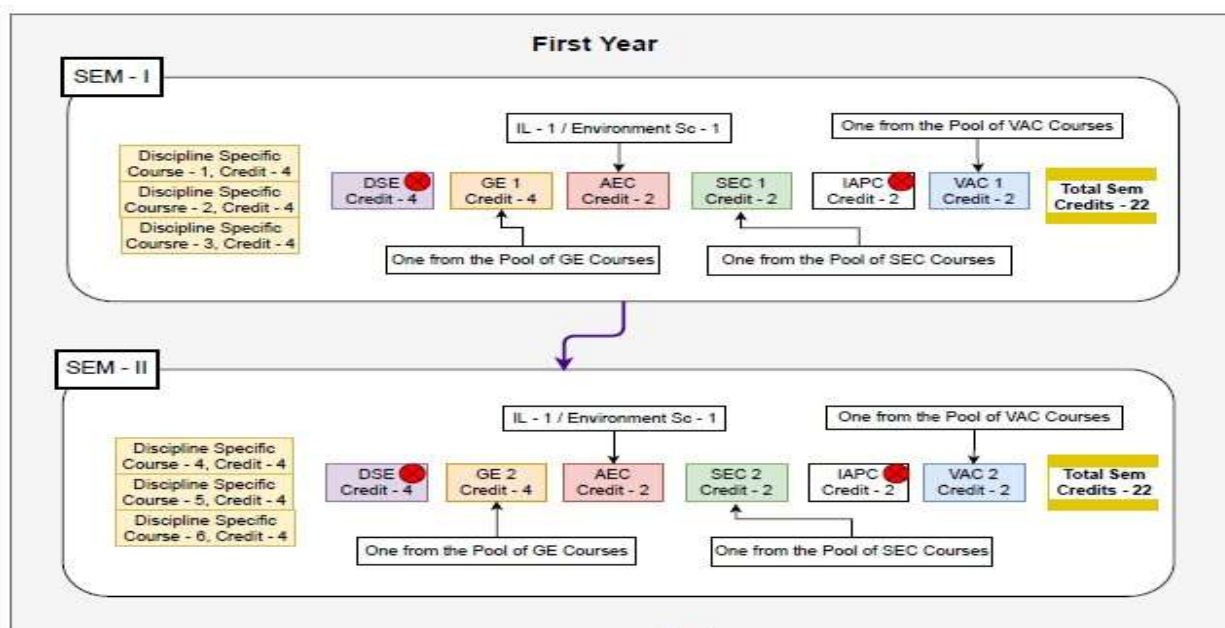

The University of Delhi introduced B.A. (Hons.) Social Work programme in 1995 realizing the importance of professionalism for social workers at grassroots and intermediate levels. This revised programme based on UGCF 2022 in accordance with the National Education Policy 2020, offers a wide variety of courses to help the students to learn about the national and global scenario of social work in an interdisciplinary mode. Being an applied stream of social sciences and a practice-based programme, it is comprised of classroom teaching and field work practicum in real life settings.

Classroom teaching is directed towards familiarizing students with the methods, principles and skills required for social work intervention and developing students' personality through inculcation of democratic and humanitarian attributes and values. Field work practicum in social work curriculum is considered the signature pedagogy as it denotes the vital methodology of teaching learning to prepare the students for professional practice. Field work is managed through a network of various NGOs and government organizations working in the field of social welfare and development sectors where the students get first-hand experience of various social issues and programmes to address the same. In fact, it is designed to develop social work professionals with essential knowledge, skills, attitudes, competence to work with various national and international development organizations.

B.A. (Hons.) Social Work is one of the best job-oriented programmes and after completion of this programme, the students can get employment opportunities both in the public and private sectors. There is also an opportunity of self-employment as they can establish their own organizations. There are numerous job opportunities in

social welfare and development sectors - like family and child welfare, education, health care, community health and nutrition, mental health, youth welfare, women development, elderly, rural and urban development, career guidance, pre & post marital counselling and life coaching, environment and research.

Besides, the social work professionals would also be engaged in providing welfare services, become part of the developmental process, respond to the needs of human rights, social justice, empowerment and liberation of weaker and vulnerable sections of the society.

This is the best suited course for those who have sensitivity towards social concerns and wish to take up challenges to improve the lives of marginalized sections of the society.

The students were taken to Aanchal Charitable Trust, Vaishali for an exposure to field realities and working with special children.

The Department proudly celebrated the 5<sup>th</sup> National Social Work Week on 20<sup>th</sup> August 2024. This event was an opportunity to highlight the critical role of school social work. The Department organised an inclusive job fair on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2024 in collaboration with Samarthanam Trust for Disabled supported by Barclays. Prof. Rajkishore Sharma, Research Dean from DU presided over the function as chief guest, other guests included Mr. Satish K, Placement Head Pan India Samarthanam Trust and Mr. Shivram Deshpande, operation Head Samarthanam Trust, Mr. Mohammed Al-Herbish (Managing Director), Mr. Sabyasachi Dasmohapatra (Vice president, Public Affairs), Mr. Rajat Kumar (Manager, Public Affairs), Ms. Reetuparna Dutta (Public Affairs Specialist) from Aramco. The company donated 9 motorized wheelchair to differently abled persons. A total of 371 prospective candidates appeared in the Job fair for the interview, 117 candidates were shortlisted on the spot. The job fair brought 23 companies together to offer job opportunities in various fields based on skill set and experience of the candidates.

National Consultation on "Bharatiya Models of Community Development" was held on 15<sup>th</sup> October, 2024. Distinguished guests, including Prof Neera Agnimitra, Chair of the International Relations Committee, Prof Balaram Pani, Dean of Colleges, DU and Dr Yugal Jha, Principal of KKM College participated and shared valuable insights.

The Department organized a First Aid Training Program on 24<sup>th</sup> September, 2024 in association with Indian Oil to equip students with essential lifesaving skills. Mr. Gaurav Gupta, Manager at Indian Oil and Dr. Chandradeep Chandra conducted a live demonstration on CPR techniques, providing practical insights into handling cardiac emergencies.

The students of semester V were taken to CASA an NGO in Udaipur for five days rural camp from 30<sup>th</sup> September- 5<sup>th</sup> October 2024 to give them exposure to rural life, interaction building with community people using PRA techniques and group living.

The students were taken to a day long exposure visit to National Commission on Human Rights (NHRC), New Delhi on 6<sup>th</sup> November 2024 for expert discussion about the role of NHRC in India.

The technical session titled "Field Work Realities – Challenges and Expectations" featured a panel discussion with representatives from 24 participating NGOs who shared critical insights into fieldwork supervision and collaboration. Prof. Sushma Batra, Retired professor from Department

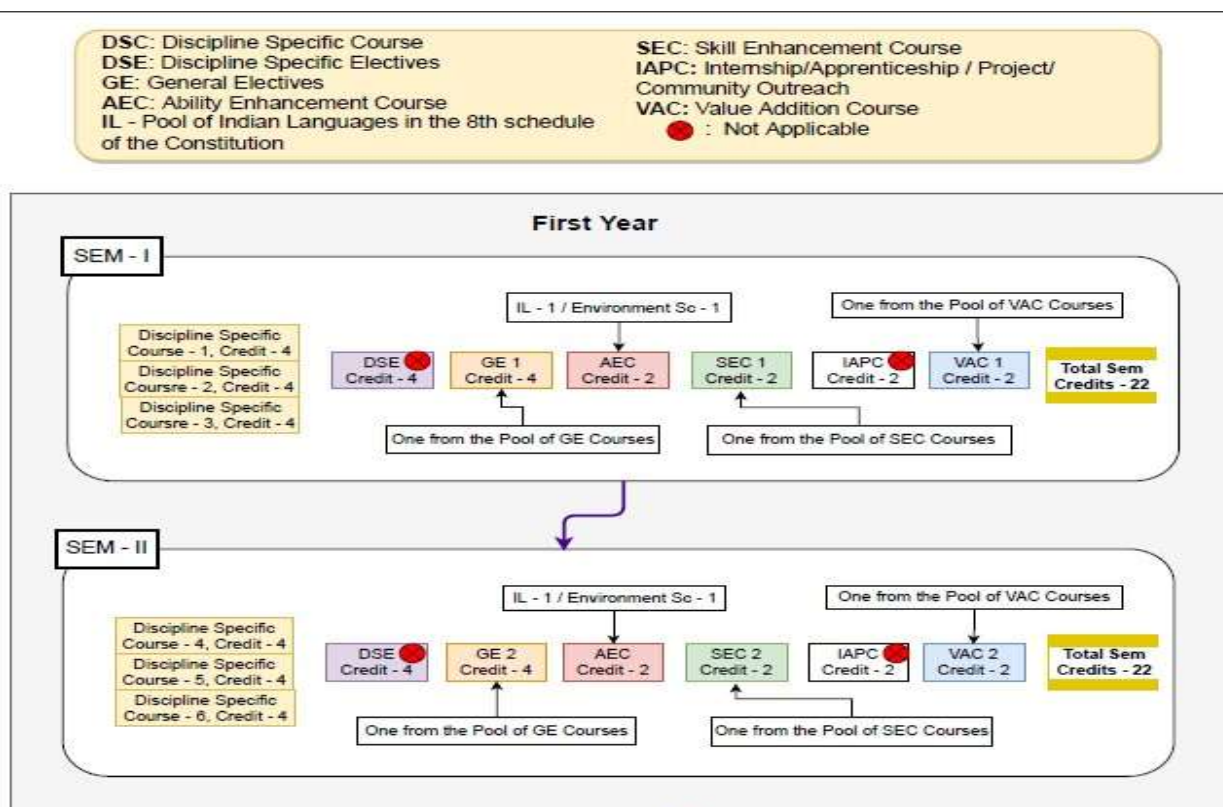

### \*Components of Field Work Practicum

**A. Observation Visits:** Students of semester-1 will be given an opportunity to visit and observe agency/community settings in order to know about the initiatives of governmental and non-governmental organizations towards social concerns.

**B. Orientation Programme:** Three-day orientation programme will be organized at the commencement of the course at the beginning of semester-1, semester-3 and semester-5 of first, second, and third years respectively before starting concurrent field work. Attendance in orientation programme is compulsory.

**C. Concurrent Field Work:** Concurrent field work is required to be conducted simultaneously with classroom teaching of courses from the very beginning of all the semesters (both odd and even) of first, second and third years and shall continue till the preparation leave before the commencement of the examinations. Two days in a week (Wednesday and Friday) will be allotted to the students to perform concurrent field work. The students may be placed in social welfare agencies or open community settings to initiate and participate in the direct service delivery. The students are required to prepare a learning report of his/her weekly field work visits and submit the same on a weekly assigned day to the respective College Supervisors.

**D. Rural Camp:** Rural camp will be organized for the students of semester-5 or 6 for approximately 3-5 days to provide exposure to the students about the socio-economic, political, and cultural situations and realities of rural life. The rural camp will be organized under the guidance of the faculty members. Attendance of rural camps is compulsory. There shall be weightage of rural camps in the internal assessment of field work for performance, behaviour and learning in the rural camps which shall be awarded by the respective College Supervisors. The hours of rural will be calculated in the total field work hours of a student after submission of report in the prescribed format.

**E. Block Field Work:** At the end of semester-4 of the second year, the students will be required to undergo four-week block field work training in a social welfare agencies or community-based projects in or outside Delhi. The block field work agencies/projects will be selected with the consent/choice of the students. A student preferably to be placed under the supervision of professionally qualified social worker in the agencies/projects. A student has to start the block field work on the date specified by the Department of the respective College in the placement letter. Any unreasonable delay in joining block field work or discontinuation will be treated as misconduct. If a student leaves block field work agency without prior approval of agency and/or Department or if his/her performance is found to be unsatisfactory, then he/she will have to repeat the block field work. During block field work, a student will be expected to submit the complete report to the Department in a prescribed manner in the Semester-5. Leave may be allowed during the period of block field work mainly on the ground of sickness. Successful completion of block field work is mandatory before the Bachelor with Honours in Social Work degree can be awarded. The hours of block field work will be calculated in the total field work hours of a student after submission of report as prescribed by the Department of respective College.

**F. Skill Development Workshops:** The skill development workshop is a platform in which the values, principles, methods, techniques, tools etc. are translated into practice skills, i.e. ‘learning by doing’. Through the experimental learning in the workshops, insights are acquired to develop the personal self and the professional self.

**Note:** Eighty percent (80%) attendance in the concurrent field work and sixtyseven percent (67%) attendance in theory classes is compulsory. Those who fail to secure the mandatory attendance will be **DETAINED** in the semester end examinations and field work viva voce.

### **Assessment of Field Work Practicum:**

The student should be assessed for effort and progress towards task assigned from one point of stage to another in the learning process during the field work. The field work assessment will be done by both internal supervisor and external examiner. The distribution of internal and external marking scheme will be 120 marks and 40 marks respectively. The students will be required to appear in the field work viva-voce before the external examiner on scheduled university examination day.

If the required hours of field work practicum and its components are not completed by any student by the end of any semester in which he/she is studying, an assessment of the performance of the student with a ‘fail’ recommendation will be given by the College Supervisor.

Geography, as an interdisciplinary and evolving discipline, focuses on understanding spatial patterns and processes—from natural landscapes and climate systems to cities, cultures, economies, and political structures. It equips students to analyze how environments are shaped by human and natural forces, how resources are distributed and managed, and how spatial thinking can help address global and local challenges.

Our curriculum offers a balanced and contemporary mix of foundational subjects and emerging areas of study. Core themes include Physical Geography, Human Geography, Environmental Geography, Political and Economic Geography, Agricultural and Urban Geography, Social Geography, and Geographies of Health and Well-being. The department also emphasizes hands-on skills through specialized courses like Digital Cartography, Remote Sensing, and Geographical Information Systems (GIS)—tools that are highly valued in today's data-driven world.

Further, students engage with real-world issues through applied papers in Disaster Management, Climate Change, and Sustainable Development, nurturing their ability to critically assess and respond to contemporary environmental and societal problems.

## Glimpses of the Department Activities

**Field Trips:** Fieldwork is an essential pillar of geographical learning, offering students real-world exposure to diverse physical, socio-economic, and cultural environments. The Department of Geography organizes compulsory, self-financed field trips as part of the practical curriculum for Field Work and Research Methodology (Semester IV) and Disaster Management (Semester VI).

In 2025, under the Research Methodology paper, students undertook a week-long field study to Chittorgarh and Udaipur, focusing on the impact of urbanisation on satellite villages surrounding Udaipur. This immersive experience enabled them to observe and analyze patterns of rural transformation and urban influence in the region. For the Disaster Management component, students explored the Tirthan Valley, Kullu, Jibhi, and Jalori Pass in Himachal Pradesh. The tour provided hands-on learning about disaster risk, ecological fragility, and community resilience in mountainous terrains.

These field excursions not only deepen academic understanding but also strengthen students' research, observation, and analytical skills—preparing them for advanced studies and professional roles in geography and beyond.



**BHU-Chetna:** An annual inter-college geography-fest is organized to deepen the understanding and appreciation of geography. Bhu-Chetna provides a platform for students to showcase their knowledge, creativity, and analytical skills through creative displays of expression while also encouraging a vibrant and interactive learning environment. The activities include Geo-quiz, debates, map pointer, essay writing, painting, and photography competitions.

### **Department Magazine: (Topophilia)**

The Department of Geography proudly launched its annual magazine Topophilia, themed “Environment and Health: Understanding the Influence of Environment on Physical and Mental Well-being.” This student-led initiative features articles, research essays, creative writings, and visual reflections contributed by students and faculty. It explores the intersection of geography, sustainability, urbanization, health, and environmental justice through diverse perspectives. The magazine showcases departmental activities, academic engagements, and field experiences from the 2024–25 session. It reflects the department’s commitment to nurturing critical thinking, interdisciplinary inquiry, and student-led academic expression.

### **Other Activities**

The Department of Geography actively cultivates academic excellence and interdisciplinary engagement through a rich calendar of events including seminars, workshops, special lectures, and conferences. These platforms provide students with exposure to contemporary debates, technological advances, and real-world challenges in geography and allied fields.

In April 2025, the department successfully hosted a landmark International Conference on “Geographies of Health and Hygiene”, bringing together a diverse body of scholars from across India, USA, Canada, Australia, and Russia. The conference featured Prof. Barkatullah Khan as the Chief Guest, and Prof. Kaushal Kumar Sharma as Keynote Speaker. Eminent geographers including Prof. S.C. Rai, Prof. Neena Pandey, and others from prestigious Indian universities contributed to thematic sessions. The presence of Nagma Sahar, a distinguished journalist and geographer from NDTV, added further value with her thought-provoking address linking media, society, and spatial health challenges. The department also organized special lectures throughout the year. Notably, Prof. Anu Kapur (Delhi School of Economics) delivered a scholarly talk on geographical thought, disaster studies, and environmental geography. Similarly, Dr. Arun Sharma, Founder of IMANAH, shared his expertise during a Natural Health Camp, emphasizing the importance of holistic well-being and sustainable lifestyle practices.

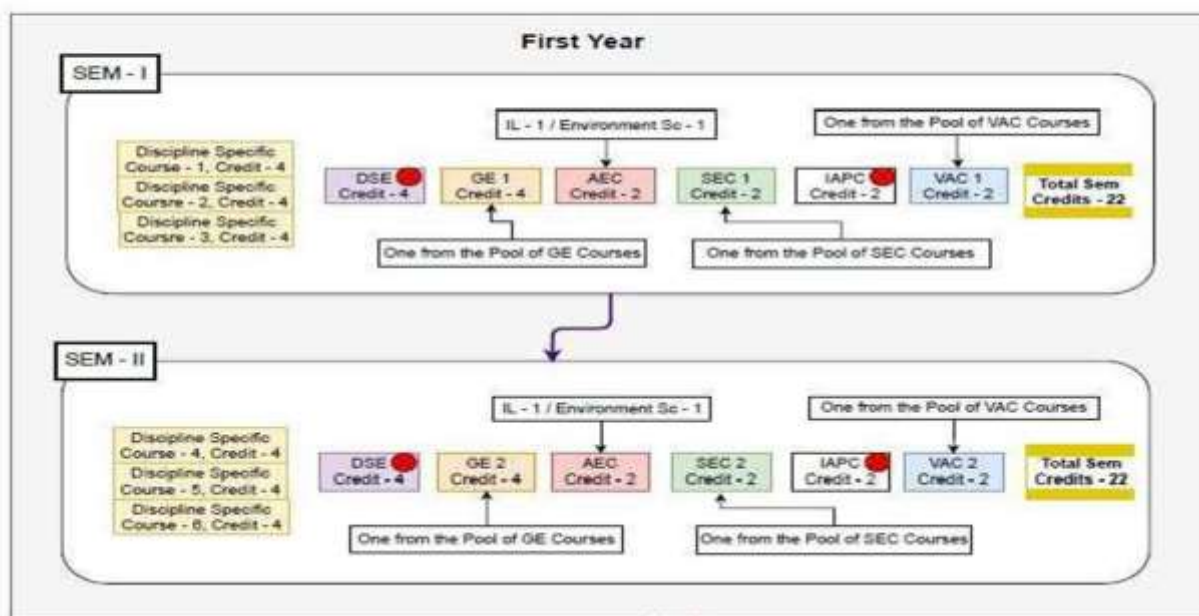

History has been and continues to be an extremely popular choice among students planning to pursue the bachelor's degree. The discipline, at an academic level, satisfies our craving, to fathom our past, to comprehend the trajectories of the growth of human societies across the world and at the same time helps us unravel and analyze systematically the genesis and the root causes for many of our contemporary problems. History has always been a very popular subject for a variety of competitive examinations given its seamless cohesion with many social science disciplines. Significant shifts in the historiographical concerns in the last half a century have shifted the focus of discourse and research from documenting the plethora of ruling dynasties in Indian History and their historical contexts to a more complex paradigm of exploring the historical changes in social, economic, and cultural domains. This has made the historical enquiry an enriching exercise in analyzing historical questions through interdisciplinary method. For example, Environmental history and Historical geography bring the disciplines of History and Geography together, analyses of political systems and state structures in the past bring History and Political Science together and historical engagements with social issues like caste, gender, education, and such like necessitate some knowledge of Sociology and social theory. History has also emerged as a foundation stone for much more specialized career-oriented courses related to Archaeology, Museology, Heritage and Conservation of Historical materials including monuments and artefacts. Careers such as these are challenging but at the same time provide ample opportunities in this competitive and globalized world. Department of History offers admission in two courses- B.A (Hons.) and B.A (Programme) under NEP scheme adopted by University of Delhi. From this Academic session 2025-26, Department of History will introduce Semester VII/VIII (Fourth Year) under the NEP framework for the students of History B.A. (Hons.) and B.A.(Programme) multidisciplinary.

### **(Teacher In Charge)**

The vision of the department is to bring out the potential of students by providing quality teaching and to work for the well-being of society through the study of Mathematical sciences. The teaching methodology in the department focuses on developing critical thinking and problem-solving skills, content knowledge, and the ability to communicate ideas effectively to students and prepare them as an ambassador of Mathematics for the future generation. The department organizes national and international level programs at regular intervals throughout the year not only for the students of the department but also for the students and the faculty of different colleges of the University.

The department offers BA (Programme) Major and Non-Major (also called Minor) discipline courses, and GE (Generic Elective) courses for all Honours courses of other departments. SEC (Skill Enhancement Courses) and VAC (Value Added Courses) are also offered and taught by the mathematics department. The department faculty members are highly experienced and skilled. BA(P) students are required to opt two Non-Major discipline courses (subjects) and one Major discipline course from the one of Non-Major subject. Students who intend to opt for Mathematics as Major discipline course in BA(P) may continue (optional) in 4th year of BA(P) to get BA (Honours) Mathematics degree. The students who wish to opt for BA(P) Mathematics or GE Mathematics course are required to have studied and passed class 12<sup>th</sup> Mathematics. Students studying department mathematics courses may find it very helpful in preparation of competitive examination for jobs or higher studies (MBA/MCA etc.) especially enhancing their Analytical Ability, Logical Ability and Mathematical topics.

The Department of Environmental Studies at Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College was established in response to the University of Delhi's initiative to introduce a compulsory course on Environmental Studies for all students. Since its inception in the academic year 2014-15, the department has been imparting environmental education and awareness to students across various disciplines. Under the Choice Based Credit System (CBCS) and now the New Education Policy (NEP), the course has evolved to provide a comprehensive understanding of environmental issues through an integrated, problem-oriented approach with practical and fieldwork components. Specifically, this paper as an 'Ability Enhancement Course' (AEC-EVS) is divided into a two-year course, comprising two credits in the first year and two credits in the second year, with a theory and practical-based teaching system for all students.

The course covers a wide range of topics, including ecology, energy resources, biodiversity, conservation, pollution, waste management, environmental policy and practices, human communities, and global climate change. The department collaborates with field experts and offers internship opportunities, promoting field-based research, participation in conferences, workshops, and seminars. 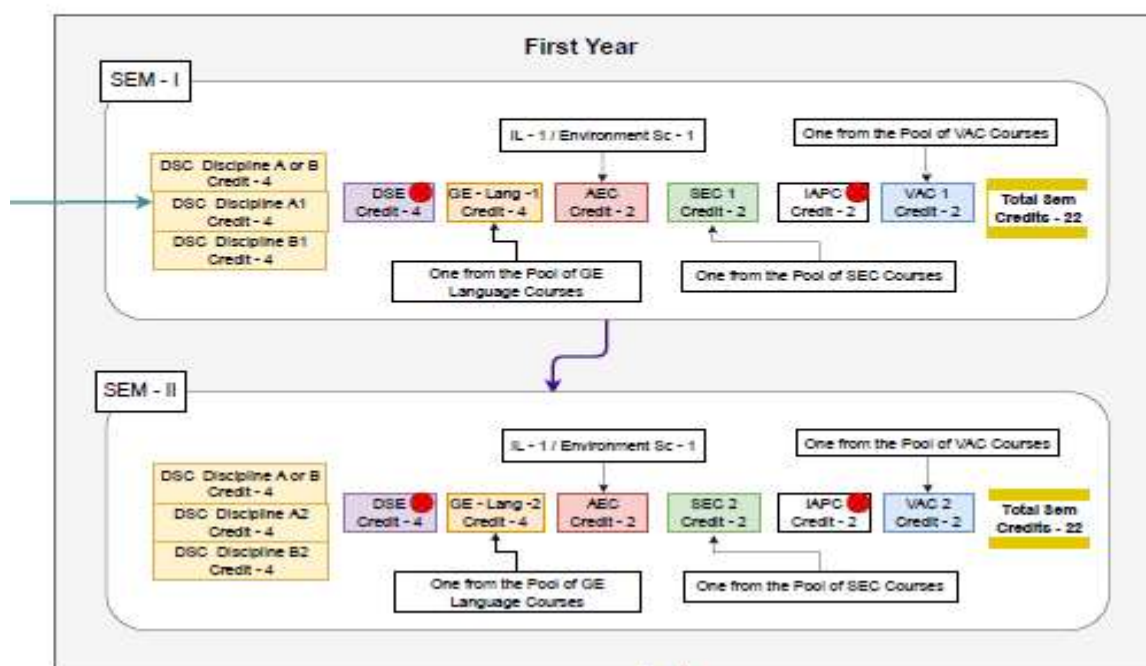

#### DSCs (Discipline Specific Core):

1. A student will be studying three DSCs from disciplines/Combinations they are enrolled in.
2. A student pursuing has an option to do 'Major' and 'Minor' in UG four-year programme.
3. A student is required to take two DSCs (DSC-1 & DSC-2) in the discipline he/she wishes to do 'Major' in, and one DSC paper (DSC-3) as 'Minor' in Semester-I & II

For Ex- A student seeking admission in **Geography and Political Science** may take Geography as major (taking two DSC papers from Geography) and Political Science as Minor (Taking one DSC paper from Political Science)

**Or**

A student seeking admission in **Geography and Political Science** may take Political Science as major (taking two DSCs from Political Science) and Geography as Minor (Taking one DSC from Geography)

4. A student wishing for 'Major or 'Minor' in a particular discipline, must choose DSC papers of those specific disciplines which are in the combinations, he/she has sought admission in.

**For Ex:** For **BA (Programme) Economics+ Mathematics**

A student shall study two disciplines, i.e., Economics and Mathematics

DSC-1 may be of any Discipline say A or B (say, Economics / Mathematics),

DSC-2 may be of Discipline A (say, Economics) and

DSC-3 may be of Discipline B (say, Mathematics).

6. Major and Minor shall be awarded on fulfilment of the following conditions:

Major = 80 credits, Minor = 28 credits. If a student wishes to Major in Discipline A, then he/she should earn at least 80 credits in discipline A.

**Example:** A student pursues four years B.A (P) (with a combination of Economics + Mathematics)

He/she shall get a Major in Mathematics if he/she earns Minimum 80 credits in Mathematics. He/she shall get a Minor in Economics if he/she earns a minimum of 28 credits.

7. There is no restriction of number of students seeking a particular discipline as major or minor if the DSCs of that discipline are in the combinations, he/she is enrolled in.

### Generic Elective (GE) Information/Guidelines:

1. A student pursuing B.A Programme with a specific combination will be required to choose Generic Elective papers from list of GE Language Pool **Only**.
2. The college is offering two Languages in GE Language pool i.e., **English** and **Hindi**.
3. There are 3 options within English to choose from.
4. There are 3 options within Hindi to choose from. However, the students are required to opt only one of the three papers in Hindi Language based on the level of Hindi studied during their secondary schooling.
5. Since the college is offering two languages i.e., English and Hindi, in first two semesters, the college has decided to allot GE- Hindi Language in Semester-I and GE English Language in Semester-II.
6. The students are required to note that they have three options within 'English Language' to choose from and English language is open in Semester-II only.

**For Ex:**

In case a particular student has sought admission in the combination with English as one of the disciplines, he/she will not be allowed to choose English as GE language.

1. Only in such exceptional cases (mentioned under point 1), the students will have an option to choose the GE from GE Pool List meant for Hons Courses.
2. A student may opt for any one GE paper from the GE Pool List meant for Hons Courses in both semesters. (applicable only for students having English or Hindi as a discipline in the Combination they are enrolled in)
3. However, while choosing a GE paper from the GE Pool List (meant for Hons courses), student must ensure again that the chosen paper must not be from the same discipline which are already in their combination.

**For Ex:**

A student with English and Psychology as a combination will not be allowed to take GE English discipline from GE Pool list meant for Honours Courses.

However, they also, will not be allowed to take GE Psychology discipline from GE Pool List.

4. To Choose a paper from GE Pool List\* for Combinations with English/Hindi as one of the disciplines.
5. In case of any other clarification/query, contact/email the TICs of his/her department.

### 5TH WORLD ENVIRONMENT SUMMIT 2024

November 16-18, 2024|NDMC Convention Centre, Sansad Marg, New Delhi

The 5th World Environment Summit 2024 was organized in hybrid mode on November 16-18, 2024 at the NDMC Convention Centre, Sansad Marg, New Delhi, by the Environment and Social Development Association (ESDA), Delhi, in collaboration with **Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College, University of Delhi**, Hansraj College, Amity University Haryana, Villa College Maldives, Tribhuvan University, Kathmandu, Nepal, and others. The summit featured a workshop on "Statistical Methodologies for Biomedical Research," funded and supported by the Indian Council of Medical Research (ICMR), Ministry of Health & Family Welfare, Government of India. This comprehensive event garnered an impressive response, with 527 abstracts and 117 full-length papers. The summit witnessed active participation from 1,294 individuals, including 747 registered participants (318 physical and 426 virtual), 160 workshop attendees, 260 volunteers, and 130 faculties and speakers.

The summit was graced by the presence of esteemed guests and speakers, including **Shri Ramnath Thakur Ji, Honorable Union Minister of Agriculture**, Government of India; **Dr. Amzath Ahmed, Honorable Minister of Fisheries and Ocean Development, Maldives**; **Justice Sudhir Agarwal Ji, Judicial Member**, National Green Tribunal (NGT), New Delhi; **Padma Bhushan Dr. Anil Prakash Joshi**, Founder, HESCO, Dehradun; and **Padma Shri Raja Lakshman Singh**, Water Conservationist & Lapodiya Garh, Jaipur, Rajasthan.

Other notable speakers included Prof. Raj Kumar, Director, Vallabhbhai Patel Chest Institute, University of Delhi; Prof. Sada Nand Prasad, Principal Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College; Prof. (Dr.) Rama, Principal, Hansraj College; Dr. Hamida Khanum, Professor of Dhaka University and Dr. Manta Devi Nowbuth, Associate Professor from the University of Mauritius. Through various events, workshops, and individual sessions, the committee aims to empower students to navigate their academic and personal lives with confidence, resilience, and a growth mindset.

In the academic year 2024–25, the Counselling Committee of Dr. Bhim Rao Ambedkar College, under the convenorship of Prof. Anita Srivastava, organized a series of impactful and student-centric mental health initiatives. The year began with a Suicide Prevention Workshop on 9th September 2024 by Ms. Shrinkhla Sahai and Mr. Nikhil Thiyyar, followed by a Suicide Prevention Help Desk on 17th September, fostering open dialogue and awareness around mental health. On 10th October, to mark World Mental Health Day, the Committee conducted a Mental Health Workshop with Dr. Sundeep Katevarapu and hosted an engaging Mental Health Help Desk, promoting well-being through interactive activities. A special movie screening of *Inside Out* was held on 17th February 2025 to help students reflect on emotional literacy and inner resilience. The year culminated in a landmark celebration—**the Silver Jubilee of the Counselling Committee** on 18th March 2025, commemorating 25 years of dedicated service with a keynote address by renowned psychologist Prof. Aruna Broota and our Guest of honor Prof. P.C. Patanjali. These events reflected the committee’s unwavering commitment to psychological support, awareness, and holistic student development.

### ***Activities Conducted in the session 2024-25***

#### **International Yoga Day Celebration on 21<sup>st</sup> June 2024**

#### **Day 1: A Foundation for Holistic Growth**

### **Keynote Address by Dr Anu Kapur on the topic ‘The Holistic Path’**

Dr Anu Kapur in her inaugural address underlined the foundation for the two days. She emphasized the interconnection between physical health, emotional stability, mental clarity, and spiritual growth. Her core message focussed on true well-being which can be achieved only when all these aspects are in harmony. Dr Kapur introduced the 8-fold path of Buddha, quoting "*One moment can change a day, one day can change a little life, one life can change the world.*" She explained that mindful actions, meditation, compassion, and right understanding are the building blocks for sustainable well-being. Her talk motivated participants to reflect on their lifestyle choices and adopt practices that align the body and mind in order to foster lasting health.



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### **Session by - Quanto Shivo, Founder of Quanto Life**

Quanto Shivo's session centred on the power of universal energy and how individuals can tap into it. He engaged the audience in deep self-reflection with the question "Who am I?"

Dr Subash Sethi shifted the focus to practical health management and self-healing. He introduced a master key to health, which is asking oneself:

“What is it? Why should I do it? How should I do it?”

His teachings revolved around understanding the cause behind any health issue

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### **Day 2: A Deep Dive into Holistic Practices**

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#### **Session by Sheetal Khurana, Tarot Reader**
